The Alamo

On the east side of Alamo Plaza is the most famous spot in Texas where 189 defenders fell on March 6, 1836, after repeated attacks by Mexican General Santa Anna's army. Mission San Antonio de Valero (The Alamo) was established in 1718 as the city's first mission. The chapel, one of the most photographed facades in the nation, and the Long Barracks are all that remain of the original fort.

Aztec on the River

The new Aztec on the River is a San Antonio delight. It is a rare and incredible jewel on the Riverwalk. Built in 1926, it is the only surviving exotic-themed movie palace in Texas. Elaborately restored to its original majesty and grandeur, every aspect of the project is designed to thrill guests, young and old, so they will come back again and again. Its fully restored lobby features a spectacular, multi-million dollar special effects show every ninety minutes.
